Intro to Academic Writing



Remember	 Academic Writing needs to be: Third Person: No 'l' or 'We' Formal: Don't use informal or every day language Objective: You need to support your work with references. Unbiased: Try and present both sides to an academic argument. Critical: Don't just describe a theory or concept. 		
Structure	 Don't forget that for essay-based assignments you need to include an introduction, a main body and a conclusion You need to write in full sentences and full paragraphs (Remember: One sentence does not make a paragraph) Try using the PEEL technique to structure your paragraphs (see activity below) 		
Time Managem	Try using the Pomodoro technique to help with time management and focused writing time Decide on a task Set Timer Work until timer goes off Have a break Repeat 		

Writing in **full paragraphs** is essential in academic writing. Do **not** write in single sentences. Try using the **PEEL technique** in the table below to form your first paragraph.

Top Tip: Once you've had a go and feel more confident you can move from using the table to highlighting the different elements within your work.

Explination (How evidence relates. Don't be too descriptive)	
Evidence (Quotation, case studyUse References!)	
Link (Back to Question AND into next paragraph)
